Angela "Angie" Marie Brinker, 88, was a loving wife, mother, grandmother, and friend. She died Tuesday, July 20, 2022 after a lengthy illness at St. Anthony Nursing Home in Carroll, surrounded by her family.

After graduating high school, she met the love of her life at the Starline dance hall. Angie was united in marriage to Luverne Brinker at St. Mary's Catholic Church on April 30, 1955 in Willey, Iowa.

Angie and Luverne enjoyed 58 beautiful years together before his death in 2013.
