December 29, 1945 - January 4, 2009

Bernard Wieland, age 63, of Templeton, Iowa, died of an apparent heart condition on Sunday, January 4, 2009, at his residence in Templeton. Karen Seyller at St. Joseph Church in Carroll. Following their marriage the couple farmed the family farm southwest of Templeton and in 2004 moved to their new home in Templeton.
