Damian "Doc" White, 73 of Carroll, died early Monday morning, September 22, 2014 at Iowa Methodist Medical Center in Des Moines, Iowa.

For most of his working career he was employed at Witt Flooring and Des Moines Marble & Mantel where he traveled doing Terrazzo work. Doc loved going for drives in his pickup truck and also enjoyed socializing on his porch. He will always be remembered as a simple man with a great sense of humor and for his generosity.
