Floyd and Annamae (Schwinger) Harman. He spent his younger years in the Iowa Falls community and graduated from Iowa Falls High School in 1945. He entered the U.S. Navy in January 1946 and served at the end of World War II as a mechanic. He was honorably discharged from the Naval Reserve in November 1952. On August 12, 1950, he was married to Mary Lou Kadolph at St. Mary Church in Eldora, Iowa. Mr. Harman began his career with the Great Plains Gas Company in 1952 in the Cedar Falls area and moved to Coldwater, Michigan, in 1966, and was moved to Carroll in 1968 to serve as District Manager. In retirement he worked part time at the Carroll Health Center, Carroll Super Wash, Earl May Nursery, and drove cars for Griffith Ford. He was a member of St. Lawrence Parish, Knights of Columbus, and Carroll American Legion. He served St. Lawrence Parish as a lector and usher. Don loved to make people laugh and was notorious for his impersonation of "Foster Brooks, The Lovable Lush". Survivors include his wife, Mary Lou Harman of Carroll; his children, Mark Harman and his wife Deb of Peoria, Ariz., Jeanne Hammen and her husband Bill of Grinnell, Joyce Baughman and her husband Dave of Bloomington, Minn., Mike Harman and his wife Sandy of Decorah, and Jeff Harman and his special friend, Deanne Naumann of Littleton, Colorado; twelve grandchildren; three great grandchildren; a brother, Bob Harman of Zearing; and brothers and sisters-in-law, Bernard Kadolph of Story City, Larry and Grace Kadolph of Eldora, Ron and Karen Kadolph of Eldora, and Rita and Darrell Allen of Iowa Falls.
