Earl Kramer, age 83, of Carroll, died early Saturday morning, January 9, 2016 at the Hawkeye Care Center in Carroll.

Born on September 20, 1932 at Carroll, Iowa, Earl Charles was the son of Nicholas and Mary (Heller) Kramer. He grew up in Carroll County. After his education Earl farmed with his father. On September 17, 1955 Earl was united in marriage to Dorothy Lehrter at St. Lawrence Catholic Church in Carroll.

The couple began their married life on Earl's family farm north of Coon Rapids where the couple was engaged in grain, livestock, and dairy farming. They then moved to a farm near Scranton where Earl farmed and worked at American Athletic in Jefferson. In 1963 the family moved to Carroll where he attended schooling for appliance repair. After his training he worked as an Appliance Repair Technician for Gambles Hardware Store. After the store closed, Earl worked for the Carroll Co-Op. In 1972 Earl purchased the current family farm near Willey where he resumed his farming operation until 1989, when he and Dorothy started Kramer's Used Store.

Earl enjoyed playing cards, trapping, fishing, antiques, animals, and his trips to the casino. Most of all Earl enjoyed the time he spent with his family and friends. Earl was a member of St. Lawrence Catholic Church in Carroll.
