He grew up near Arcadia and attended country school, later graduating from Arcadia High School. On February 14, 1949 he married his valentine sweetheart, Lucille Lutwitze at Sts. Peter and Paul Church in Carroll. Following their marriage, Ed and Lucille

farmed near Arcadia and in later years also farmed in the Carroll and Glidden area. In 1990, Ed retired from farming and he and Lucille moved to Carroll, but he never retired his overalls. He was also proud to be able to trace his lineage back many hundreds of years. Ed enjoyed baseball, basketball and was an avid reader and storyteller.
