Isabelle "Issy" Wittrock, age 92, of Carroll, died Saturday, November 28, 2020 at St. Anthony Regional Hospital in Carroll.

Born January 4, 1928 in Carroll, Iowa, Isabelle was a daughter of Ventura and Mary (Beltram) Salcedo. She resided at St. Anthony's Orphanage in Sioux

City, Iowa until 1944 when she made her home with Henry and Nell Meiners in Dedham, Iowa. She graduated from St. Angela's Academy in 1948.

Isabelle was married to Charles Wittrock on October 10, 1950. From this union six children were born. Issy loved her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren with her whole heart. She enjoyed writing poems, adult coloring, puzzles, crocheting, making paper boxes and quilts for her children and grandchildren to cherish. Issy was a follower of Jesus Christ and loved to read from her bible daily.
