James Behrens, 86 of Carroll, died early Saturday morning at Regency Park Nursing Home in Carroll.

Born on January 28, 1930 in Carroll, Iowa, James was the son of Henry and Mayme (Heithoff) Behrens. He spent his younger years in the Roselle area and attended Holy Angels School, later graduating from Carroll High School.

Jim served in the United States Army during the Korean conflict as a medic and was proud that his children followed in his footsteps being doctors and nurses. Jim was honorably discharged in 1953. On December 29, 1953 he was united in marriage to Margaret Hansman at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Willey, with Fr. H.J. Dries officiating. The couple made their home southeast of Roselle where Jim was engaged in grain and livestock farming. Jim and Margaret later moved to the Carroll community.

He enjoyed playing cards and fishing with his family and friends. Jim loved spending time with his entire family, especially his grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Jim served as President of Farmers Mutual Insurance of Roselle for 34 years. He was a lifetime member of the Templeton Knights of Columbus, 50 year member of the Carroll American Legion, former member of Holy Angels Parish in Roselle where he was active in the church board and currently a member of Holy Spirit Parish in Carroll.

Survivors include his wife of 62 years Margaret of Carroll; his children: Dr. Arthur (Rose) Behrens of Carroll, Carol Luing of Bondurant, Marilyn (William)

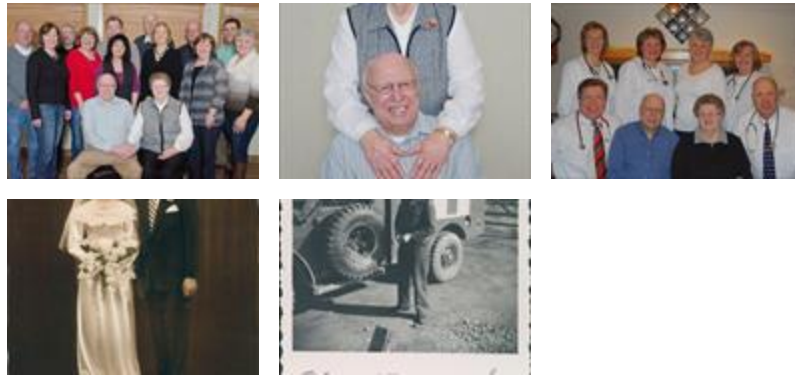
