Leo Naberhaus, 93 of Mt. Carmel, died Friday, February 13, 2015 at St. Anthony Regional Hospital in Carroll.

Leo Bernard Naberhaus was born on October 23, 1921 on the family farm west of Mt. Carmel, Iowa. He was the son of Henry and Anna (Wempe)

Naberhaus. Leo grew up near the Mt. Carmel community where he attended school at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel School, and graduated from St. Bernard's Catholic High School in Breda. After graduation Leo farmed his entire life up until his retirement. During that time Leo also worked as a field man for the Carroll County A.S.C.S. Office.

Leo enjoyed playing cards, playing softball, and baseball in his younger days, and attending his coffee group in Breda. Leo was very devoted to his faith, and the Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Parish. He was an honorary charter member of the Carroll Knights of Columbus, and an active member of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Parish.
