Louis William Starman was born June 8, 1932, in Roselle, Iowa, the youngest child of Henry and Catherine (Steffes) Starman. At a young age, his family moved to a farm in Guthrie County, where he attended a one-room country schoolhouse, Bear Grove #7. Shortly after finishing 8th grade, the family moved to Carroll, where Louis began what would become a lifetime defined by hard work and dedication.

At just 15 years old, Louis started working at Matt Furniture, where he spent 10 years there and eventually becoming a salesman. To support his growing family, he also worked early mornings for Crouse Cartage Company, before joining them full-time in 1967. Louis proudly delivered freight to Carroll Businesses for 28 years until retiring in 1995, often saying it was a “great job.”

Louis married the love of his life, Eunice Beckman, on August 19, 1952, at St. John’s Church in Arcadia. Together they shared a beautiful 64-year marriage built on faith, devotion, laughter, dancing, and unconditional love. They raised nine children in Carroll and created a home centered around family, kindness, and helping others. Their marriage was a true example of love and commitment for generations of their family.

A devoted member of Holy Spirit Church, the Knights of Columbus, and the Kuemper Parents Club, Louis generously volunteered his time to parish and school projects, including helping with updates to Kuemper Catholic School. He was known for his positive attitude, strong faith, gentle spirit, and willingness to help anyone who needed it. Whether holding Eunice’s hand, spending time with family, or lending a helping hand, Louis made people feel cared for and valued.
