Louise Friedman, 98 of Raleigh, North Carolina, and formerly of Carroll, Iowa, died early Wednesday morning, July 24, 2013 at her home in Raleigh, North Carolina.

Mass of the Christian Burial will be at 1 p.m. Saturday, August 3, 2013 at St. Lawrence Catholic Church in Carroll. The Celebrant will be Fr. Timothy Schott. Con-Celebrant and homilist will be Fr. Born on October 26, 1914 at Carroll, Iowa, Louise was the daughter of William and Anna (Kruse) Scharfenkamp. She spent her younger years in the Carroll community and attended Sts. Peter and Paul School, later graduating from St. Angela Academy. Louise then received a degree in nursing from St. Anthony School of Nursing, graduating in 1935. Upon graduation she was employed at St. Anthony Hospital in Carroll and later the Carroll Clinic. On August 26, 1940 she married Walter L. Friedman at Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Carroll, Iowa. The couple resided in several Midwestern states while Walter was employed with Montgomery Ward Company, and later settled in Rhinelander, Wisconsin. In 1998 Walter and Louise moved to Raleigh, North Carolina. Louise enjoyed playing bridge but her greatest joy was her grandchildren. She was a member of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in Raleigh, North Carolina and was also a member of the Third Order of St. Francis of Assisi.
