Sturm Jr. at Phoenix City, Alabama while he was stationed with the United States Army. Following his honorable discharge the couple moved back to the Carroll area.

Lucy had various jobs in Carroll County and was also a devoted wife and mother while her husband was engaged in farming in the Maple River, Lidderdale, and Mt. Carmel areas. In 1970, Frank and Lucy moved to Carroll.

She enjoyed playing cards and was gifted at crocheting and quilting. Lucy's greatest joy was her entire family. Lucy was currently a member of Holy Spirit Church in Carroll.
