October 10, 1924 - August 7, 2017

Marvin Snyder, age 92, of Carroll, died Monday, August 07, 2017, at St. Anthony Nursing Home in Carroll.

Mass of the Christian Burial will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Friday, August 11, 2017 at St. Lawrence Catholic Church in Carroll. The Celebrant will be Fr. Brian Feller. Mass servers will be great-grandsons: Ben Gerken and Grant Gerken. Music will be by Kate Cuddy and the St. Lawrence Choir. Lector for the funeral mass will be granddaughter, Kim Gerken. Born on October 10, 1924 at Maple River, Iowa, Marvin was the son of Matthew and Minnie (Rutten) Snyder. He attended country school and later attended Carroll High School. When Marvin was 17 years old his mother passed away and his step-mother, Ann Feld was instrumental in his life. He served in the United States Army and following his honorable discharge returned to the Carroll area. On April 8, 1947, Marvin was united in marriage to Florence Kennebeck at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Willey. The couple made their home in Carroll where Marvin was employed at Heider Manufacturing and following their closing worked for Scranton Manufacturing. Marvin also worked many years at the Super Car Wash in Carroll.

Marvin enjoyed playing cards, video card games, reading, doing puzzles, and was an avid baseball fan. He was a member of St. Lawrence Church and the Carroll American Legion.

Marvin is survived by his children: Bill (Jean) Snyder of Carroll, John (Pat) Snyder of Templeton, Bob (Shirley) Snyder of Carroll, and Barb (Randy) Schneider of Greenwood, MO; 12 grandchildren; 26 great-grandchildren; his sisters: Millie Dion of Carroll and Evelyn (John) Wheeler of Indiana; his step-sister, Esther (Glen) Eich of Omaha; his sisters-in-law and brothers-in-law: Ruth Ann Snyder of Carroll, Eugene (Bud) Kennebeck of Carroll, Mary Bernholtz of Carroll, Doris (Bill) Bruggeman of Lidderdale, and Larry (Della) Hinnners of Manning; as well as many nieces, nephews, other extended relatives.

“ *Marvin's sister Evelyn and I got married in Hollywood in June 1945, neither of us had met the others family. I was in the Navy stationed in Santa Ana...shortly after our wedding I received orders to Love Field Dallas, Texas to begin flight training. While all this was going on Marvin had been drafted into the Army and was stationed at Camp Fannin in Tyler, Texas, about 80 miles from Dallas. We took a bus to Tyler and met Marvin at the PX...he had been out on bivoac and was brought in to meet us. Marvin gave us his trademark big grin but was uneasy meeting me for the first time, he being a brand new rookie GI not being sure whether to salute, shake my hand, or give me a hug, he ended up doing all three.. That was the first of the Snyder family for me, Evelyn didn't get a chance to meet my family in Ohio for another six weeks. He and I hit it off as brothers right from the start, both fairly short, telling stories that brought laughter to those around us He and Florence visited us a couple of times in Ohio but the distance kept us from having the good times together that I'm sure we could have had. Evelyn and Marvin being about a year's difference in ages were quite close growing up on the farm, double dating and all those things that farm kids enjoy doing together. Leonard, Rudell, and now Marvin have passed on, now its just Evelyn and her sister Millie to carry on what Math and Minnie Snyder started so many long years ago.
