Mary Ann Schulte, age 96, of Carroll, passed away Wednesday October 16, 2024 at St. Anthony Nursing Home in Carroll.

she worked for attorney B.L. Willis in Lake City.

On September 1, 1952 Mary Ann was united in marriage to Lenus Schulte at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Auburn. They farmed and raised their family near Auburn. They later retired and moved to Carroll in 1984. Mary Ann moved to Sunnybrook Assisted Living in 2017 and to St. Anthony Nursing Home in 2021.

Mary Ann was a strong devoted Catholic. Her faith was very important to her, she loved praying the rosary at least once a day throughout her adult life. She showed tremendous grace and strength in the face of enormous grief when she lost her beautiful daughter Suzanne in 2012. She was an amazing cook, her recipe box is a Schulte family treasure.
