Matthew Laing, 37 of Kansas City, Missouri and formerly of Carroll, died unexpectedly on Sunday, June 15, 2025 in Kansas City, Missouri.

He completed EMT training while in high school and later continued his medical training in Iowa City becoming a paramedic. He loved his time as a flight nurse saving lives. Matt handled emergency situations with calm efficiency and compassion throughout his life. He was currently working as charge nurse at Monterey Park in Kansas City, Missouri. Traveling, running, spending time with his dogs Mya and Rylie were passions of his.

Matt could confidently walk into any room, instantly making it feel like his own. From a young age, he had a remarkable ability to connect with anyone he met. He embraced life with a natural sense of leadership and a heart full of kindness. Whether it was a furry friend or a family member, Matt treated everyone with the same care and respect.
