Michael Logan, age 64, of Carroll, died Wednesday, November 25, 2015, at St. Anthony Regional Hospital in Carroll.

Michael Logan was born on September 10, 1951 at Riverside, California, the son of Harold and Nellie (Fisher) Elliott. He grew up in the San Gabriel Valley Area, and in 1969 he graduated from Sierra Vista High School in Baldwin Park, California. During high school Michael won many mechanics awards, and he was one of the fastest to tear down, and rebuild a motor.

After graduation Michael enlisted in the United States Marine Corps where he

earned the National Defense Medal, and the Good Conduct Medal. Upon his honorable discharge he became an apprentice plumber, however he enjoyed truck driving more, and began his career as an over the road truck driver. Michael lived in Joplin, Missouri, Vermont, and Maine before moving to Emerson, Iowa. It was here he met the soul of his life, Jeannie Pierson, and the couple later moved to the Carroll community. Michael enjoyed trucking, fishing, history, and researching U.F.O.'s.
