In the late 1970s, her parents moved to Spencer and Patti moved to Carroll to become a resident of the newly opened New Hope Village.

New Hope Village turned out to be a God given blessing for Patti. Patti enjoyed all of the creative activities that kept her busy and entertained. She especially enjoyed the wheelchair races, bowling, Halloween parties and any other outing or activity.

Patti is survived by a brother Richard Jobe of Wyoming, Minnesota and a sister Kay Larsen of Carroll, Iowa. She was preceded in death by her parents and brother Stanley Jobe.
