Ronald Hahn, 71 of Roselle, died unexpectedly on Wednesday, February 3, 2021.

A Funeral Mass will be held at 10:30 a.m., Tuesday, February 9, 2021 at St. John Paul II Parish - Holy Spirit Church in Carroll. The Celebrant will be Fr. Timothy Schott. Music will be by Jane Heithoff. Burial will be in Holy Angels Cemetery in Roselle. Visitation will be held from 5-7 p.m. Monday at the Sharp Funeral Home in Carroll. There will be no visitation prior to the Funeral Mass on Tuesday.

Ron worked for Snyder Tree Service after graduation, then Bob's Circle Steel for several years and retired from Renze Hybrids after many years. Ron

Ron was also a member of the Roselle Trio Tavern slow pitch team which made 2 trips to the state tournament.
