Sharon Collison, 85 of Carroll, and formerly of Arcadia, died Saturday, September 20, 2025 at Regency Park Nursing Home in Carroll.

A Funeral Mass will be held at 10:30 a.m., Saturday, September 27, 2025 at Holy Spirit Church – St. John Paul II Parish in Carroll. The Celebrant will be Fr. Craig Collison. Music will be by Kathy Halbur. Lectors for the Funeral Mass will be Mindie Simons, Kelley Pick, and Lisa Langenfeld. Gift Bearers will be Jazalyn Miller, Maddox Miller, Madalena Paes and Theodore Paes.

Eucharistic Ministers will be Julie and Scott Hodne. Honorary pallbearers will be Kellie Paes, Kimberlie Hodne, Tom Collison, Sarah Collison, and Danielle Neiman. A private family burial will be at a later date in St. John Cemetery in Arcadia.

A visitation will be held from 4:30-6:30 p.m. on Friday at the Sharp Funeral Home in Carroll with a rosary at 6:30 p.m. Additional visitation will be from 9:30-10:15 a.m. on Saturday at the church. In lieu of flowers memorials may be left for Parkinson's Foundation to help improve care and advance research.

Sharon was the daughter of Felix and Bernadette (Conroy) Langenfeld. She was born on March 8, 1940, at St. Anthony Hospital in Carroll, Iowa, and she grew up in Carroll. Sharon was proud to graduate in 1958 as part of the very first class of Kuemper High School, following its transition from St. Angela's Academy. Inspired by her Aunty Mike (Loretta Winnike) and her older sister Sandy, Sharon pursued her dream of becoming a nurse. She attended Saint Catherine's School of Nursing and Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska, graduating with her RN degree in 1961 alongside some of her closest friends.

On December 29, 1962, Sharon was united in marriage to Thomas J. Collison at St. Lawrence Catholic Church in Carroll. They met as classmates at Kuemper. Sharon quickly put together a beautiful winter wedding, when they found out that Tom had Christmas break while enlisted in the Navy in Pensacola, FL. She was excited to start her life and family with Tom and immediately began work as an Operating Nurse in Pensacola. They lived in Pensacola and in Washington D.C. while Tom was in the Navy. They had four beautiful children together, Julie, Jennifer, Timothy and Jodi.

After Tom was honorably discharged from the Navy, they returned to Iowa, settling into a beautiful farmhouse near Halbur where they could live and work close to family and friends. Sharon took great joy in attending and supporting all of her children's events in Manning. She worked as a school nurse for the Carroll Community School District for over 30 years, a role she truly loved. Sharon enjoyed driving her little Honeybee to the nearby parochial schools before eventually joining the Kuemper Catholic School system in Carroll. Sharon was a former member of the School Nurses Association, St. Augustine's Parish and Ladies Guild in Halbur and she volunteered many hours working at St. Anthony Hospital's Auxiliary Snack Bar. She retired in 2005. Even in retirement, she continued caring for others, offering help to her aunts and uncles and anyone in need.

Sharon and Tom shared 55 wonderful years on their farm. She enjoyed decorating her home for every holiday, especially for St. Patrick's Day, because she was proud to be IRISH! She became a bit famous when their home was featured in the 1992 Carroll Times as the "True Gingerbread House". She had accumulated quite the collection over the years. They each had a special meaning to her! Sharon was a wonderful cook, and she really enjoyed cooking meals for her family and toasting at the big table.

Her many hobbies included golfing, gardening, playing cards with her family and card club, reading, and keeping up with her favorite PEOPLE magazines. She and Tom treasured their travels together. When their children were young, they especially enjoyed trips to Okoboji, and in later years, to the Lake of the Ozarks. They also loved visiting their 3 children and grandchildren in California, and shared unforgettable journeys to Alaska, Hawaii, Italy, France, and Ireland.

In 2019, Sharon was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease. Tom was the very best caretaker throughout those first years until extra help was needed. Excellent care was provided by the Carroll County Home Care Aides, SARH Hospice staff, her family and some very special caregivers. Sharon and Tom moved to Carroll in June of 2024 to be closer to healthcare. Sharon was a spiritual person and prayed every day for all of us. She would say to keep faith, family and friends close. She was a wonderful card giver and always signed them with "Love and Prayers." Sharon was a loving and compassionate person whose life was filled with love and laughter. She will be deeply missed by many.

Sharon is preceded in death by her parents: Felix and Bernedette Langenfeld, Tom's parents, Marvin and Ruth Collison, her siblings, Sandy Ulveling and Dr.

Robert Langenfeld and her brothers-in-law, Paul Collison and Bill Feld.

“ Memories of Sharon -- where do I begin? For lack of a better word, the following are merely "highlights"- a loving eulogy in a sense. Sharon was a lovely lady, both inside and out! Yet, she was human, a typical woman. Prior to special occasions, such as her children's weddings, she struggled to lose a few extra pounds. In Sharon's kitchen was a large table with leaves. When she had guests, she would pull the table apart. She turned the leaf over and had her guests sign the underside. Sharon's friendship knew no boundaries -- her friendships ran the gamut! The signatures were from all walks of life, the rich and the not so rich, some quite elite individuals, some just common folk. A lasting tribute -- it exemplified the type of human being she was. She never put on airs, never held herself above others. Sharon the school nurse! My daughter wrote me a letter after I filed for divorce. She mentioned by name, six of my closest friends -- among them Sharon. My daughter went on to state: "These are in my eyes, some of the most caring, moral, loving people in the world. I hope and pray they are part of your life right now" Sharon had no idea the lasting impression she left on many her former students. Sharon was not a "fair weather" friend--she was there in good times and bad. Shortly after receiving the letter from my daughter, Sharon paid me a visit at my apartment. She gifted me with a "Comfort Angel Pocket Token". On it is this verse: "Lift my spirits with inner peace, send comfort and strength today. Show me rays of sunshine that turn darkness into day." The gift was inexpensive - yet the gesture priceless to me!! Still have the gift on my desk. Sharon was a woman of deep faith. When the occasion arose, her gifts were not as cheap! One year Sharon told me she had purchased a Pewter Chess Set for her husband for Christmas. After Christmas, I questioned if her husband was surprised -- what he thought of her gift. She replied, Tom,, being Tom, thought she was too frivolous -- the gift was too expensive -- yet she went on to assure me, she knew he valued it. No doubt in my mind, Sharon is now an "Angel" looking down from heaven above!!!

Sharon talked about all of you all the time. I remember when she wanted a new car called the Honeybee and finally Tom got the hint and bought it for her! She was so happy and excited to drive it. It was a little 2-door car and many times she had to give our principal who over 6 feet tall and heavier-set a ride down to Dedham once a week. I remember when she wanted new siding on her house! She told us about how she would tease, bug, leave notes begging Tom for new siding! When Tom said yes, she couldn't wait to tell us that she finally talked you into it!

Sharon always told us stories about you kids when you were growing up. I always felt like we knew you so well! She was so proud of all of you!

Sharon also got called on to sub for us from time to time at D-W. I always felt badly if my classes would misbehave for her. She never complained about having to be a sub!

When she moved to Holy Trinity in Halbur-Templeton-Roselle and I joined the faculty there, it was like one big happy family again with some extra special new people! Whoever she met in any of her schools, became part of her extended school family.

I could share more stories about her, but I'll close here and just end by saying I loved Sharon so much and I am so glad to get to talk with her a few weeks ago at Regency. She knew me, even though she couldn't say it; she just held my hand and squeezed it, looked

into my eyes and there was the Sharon I've always known. Sharon was one special person and will be missed greatly by all of you and many more people whose lives she has touched over the years.

PS: I'll bet she and the Lord are getting all caught up now!
