Vern Neppl, age 78 of rural Breda, died Sunday, March 6, 2011 at Twilight Acres Nursing Home in Wall Lake.

Mass of the Christian Burial will be celebrated at 10:30 a.m., Friday, March 11, 2011 at St. Bernard's Catholic Church in Breda. The Celebrant will be Fr. Following his formal education Vern served in the United States Army from 1953 until 1955 during the Korean War before his honorable discharge. For his entire lifetime Vern farmed and farming was his true passion. He was both a livestock and grain farmer until his retirement. In retirement he enjoyed bowling, hunting and

spending time with his family. Vern was a member of St. Bernard's Parish, Catholic Order of Foresters and the Breda American Legion, Fred F. and Norman J. Bruning Post # 607.
