Victor Wendl, age 86, of Carroll, Iowa, died early Friday, March 19, 2010, at the Carroll Health Center Nursing Home in Carroll. Mass of the Christian Burial will be celebrated at 10 A.M., Monday, March 22, 2010, at St. Lawrence Church in Carroll. The Celebrant will be Father Timothy Schott. Muhlbauer at St. Augustine Church in Halbur. The couple farmed south of Willey until 1981 when they retired and moved to Carroll. Victor was a long time grain farmer and cattle feeder. He was a member of St. Lawrence Parish, Parish Men's Club, Resurrection Choir, and served as a Eucharistic Minister. He was also a member of the Third and Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus, R.S.V.P. Singing Group, and volunteered at the radiology department at St. Anthony Hospital. Victor enjoyed his family, playing cards, baseball, and visiting with his friends. Survivors include his wife, Marie Wendl of Carroll; his children, David Wendl and wife Joanne of Carroll, Joseph C.
