Wayne George Klocke, age 80, of Dedham, passed away peacefully on Saturday, March 29, 2025, in Carroll. Mass of the Christian Burial will be celebrated at 10 am on Friday, April 4, 2025, at St. Joseph's Church in Dedham. The Celebrant will be Father Patrick Behm assisted by Deacon Louis Meiners. Music will be provided by Cindy Bauer and the St. Joseph's Choir. Joann Klocke will be the Lector. Wayne's grandchildren will serve as Gift Bearers and Gail Hopkins will be the Eucharistic Minister.
