Bill Vonnahme, 72 of Carroll, died late Tuesday evening at St. Anthony Regional Hospital in Carroll.

Born on August 8, 1941, in Carroll, William was the son of William B. and Laura (Noethe) Vonnahme. As a child, Bill's family moved to Early, where he attended grade school, and graduated from Sacred Heart High School. After high school Bill graduated from Buena Vista University with a Bachelors degree. He enlisted in the Army National Guard serving for six years. On April 19, 1969 he was united in marriage to Marie Book at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Jeffersonville, Indiana. Bill worked in finance at various locations around the country until he moved back to the Carroll area where he worked for Carroll County State Bank until his retirement.

Bill enjoyed fishing, ice fishing, golfing, playing cards, and was an avid outdoorsmen. He was an active volunteer, spending much of his time with the Carroll Lions Club, and delivering meals on wheels. Bill was a member of the Carroll Lions Club, Board of Directors for Carroll County State Bank, Carroll Knights of Columbus, and St. Lawrence Catholic Church.
